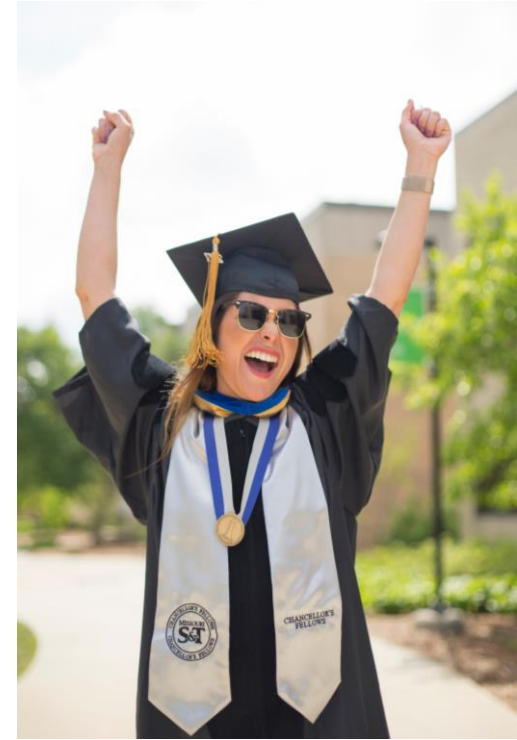

- Fall 2024 applicants should currently apply as Chemical Engineering with a Biochemical emphasis



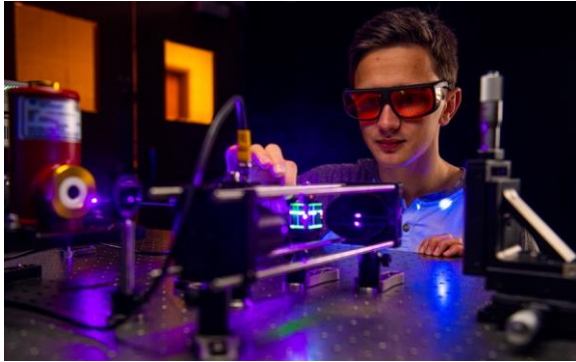
Global Engineering Program

College Prep Core Curriculum

- 4 units English
- 4 units math
- 3 units science
- 3 units social studies
- 2 units foreign language
- 1 unit fine art

- Submit transcripts
 - High school and college (if applicable)
- Submit ACT/SAT scores

*First-time college applicants for the Fall 2024 term have the option of being reviewed with or without ACT or SAT test scores

Fall 2023 Tuition Change

Plateau rate for 12-18 credit hours per semester



- ▶ **Tier 1a** – Freshmen rate
- ▶ **Tier 1b** – Humanities/Math/Education/Psychology (same cost as Tier 1a)
- ▶ **Tier 2** – Laboratory Sciences/Business/IST/Economics/Engineering Management
- ▶ **Tier 3** – Engineering/Computing

First-time College Merit-based Scholarships

Missouri residents from \$3,000 - \$11,000 per year

Out-of-State residents from \$9,000 - \$20,000 per year

- No additional application
- Based on combination of ACT/SAT score and minimum 3.0 Cum GPA
- Test Optional scholarships based on holistic review
- Upgraded through June ACT/SAT test
- Renewable 4 years with 3.0 Cum GPA



New Scholarships for Fall 2024

Solving for Tomorrow

- Missouri Residents
- AGI < \$70,000
- ACT 24+ or SAT 1160 +
- File FAFSA by February 1
- Renewable 4 years with 2.75 GPA and filing FAFSA by February 1 each year

Trailblazer

- Incoming Freshmen for Fall 2024
- First Generation Student
- \$2,000 renewable scholarship for 4 years with a 2.75 GPA



Border County Award

Students living in counties that border Missouri

- Award is 100% waiver of out-of-state tuition, renewable with 3.00 cumulative GPA
- May also be eligible for Border County Extra Award with an ACT of 28+ (or) SAT 1300+



S&T Connection Award

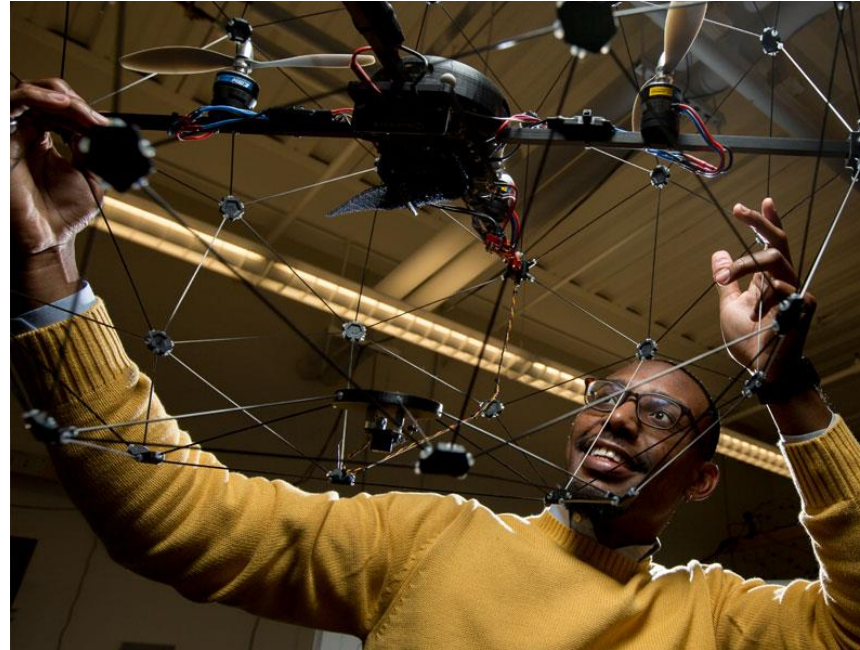
For residents of Arkansas, Kansas and Oklahoma



- Award is 100% waiver of out-of-state tuition, renewable with 3.00 Cum GPA
- May also be eligible for the Connection Extra Award with an ACT of 28+ (or) SAT 1300+

National Merit Semifinalists Competitive Scholarship Package

- \$12,000 scholarship per year
- First year on-campus housing (up to \$7,000)
- First year scholarship at The S&T Store (up to \$1,500 in technology and books)



Chancellor's Scholarship

Prestigious Scholarship for Missouri Residents

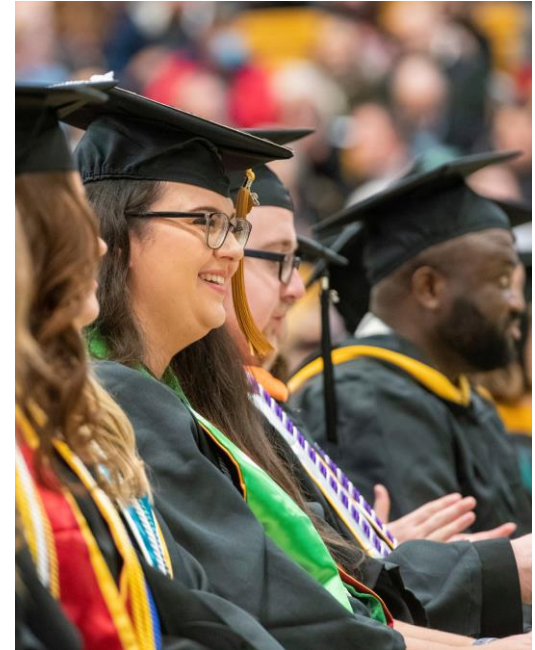


- \$13,000 per year, renewable 4 years
(replaces previous Groundbreaker award)
- Bright Flight award is stackable
- December 1 deadline
- Current Requirements:
 - ACT 31+ *(may qualify on Oct. ACT)*
 - AND 3.75 GPA
- Interviews – in January

Distinguished Scholar's Award

Prestigious Scholarship for Out-of-State Residents

- \$30,000 per year, renewable for 4 years
(replaces previous award)
- December 1 deadline
- Requirements:
 - ACT 29+ (or) SAT 1330+
 - AND 3.75 GPA
- Virtual Interviews – in January



Kummer Vanguard Scholars Program

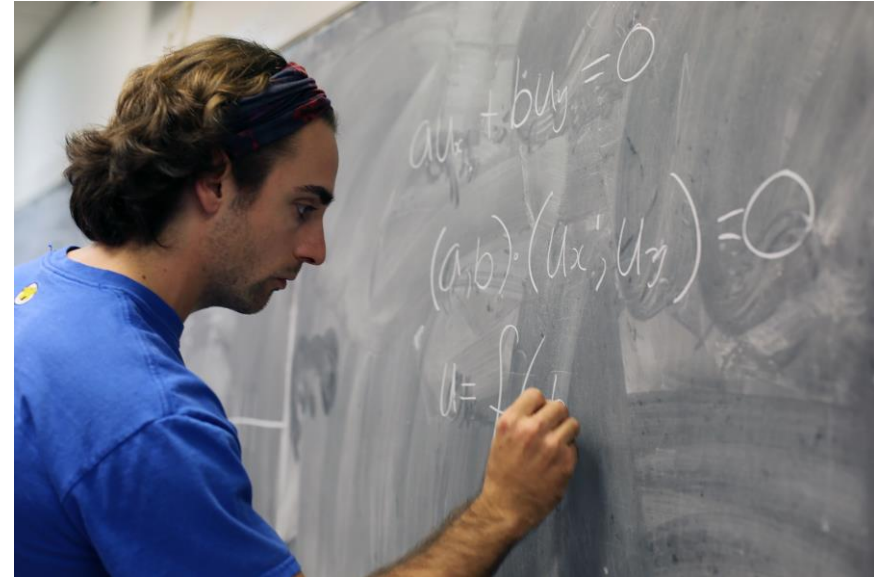
Provides scholarships to 400 undergraduate STEM scholars each year

Scholarships:

- \$1,000 - \$3,000 per year
- Renewable for 4 years with participation in program

Current Program Eligibility:

- Cum GPA of 3.4/4.0 unweighted
- 26 ACT or 1240 SAT
- Pursuing a STEM major at S&T
- FAFSA completion encouraged
- Application Deadlines to be released soon



Honors Academy

Outstanding scholars who are seeking an enhanced educational experience



Eligibility Requirements:

- GPA 3.75/4.0
- ACT 29 or SAT 1340 or Test Optional review of written essay
- Apply by February 15
- Accept offer, sign-up for Advising, and pay enrollment fee by April 15

Project Lead the Way

Course credit and Scholarships

- Undergraduate course credit awarded for these PLTW classes
 - Computer Science
 - Biomedical
 - Engineering
- 20 - \$1,000 scholarships awarded each year



Transfer Students

Admissions Requirements

- 2.50 GPA (preferred minimum)
- With 24 or more semester hours of college level credit:
 - No high school transcripts or ACT/SAT test scores required
- Fewer than 24 semester hours:
 - High school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores are required
 - Both college and high school credentials are considered

Checklist:

- Apply for admission
 - apply.mst.edu
- Submit transcripts from every college attended



Transfer Automatic Scholarships

Merit-based Awards

\$1000 - \$5,000
- **Partners in Excellence**
\$1500 - 3,000
- **Phi Theta Kappa**
\$1,000

Out-of-State Awards

- **Border County**
100% of the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition
- **Connection Award**
100% of the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition
- **Out-of-State Promise Scholarship**
\$1,000
- **Provost's International Scholarship**
\$10,000 - \$15,000

Scholarship Universe

Apply for additional scholarships once you've been admitted!

- The scholarship database matches students with scholarships for which they can apply:
 - Campus and departmental awards
 - External scholarships
 - Corporate and foundation awards
- Student will sign in with their S&T login and password to begin.



- The more questions the student answers, the more scholarships they will be matched with – some will require additional application or essay.

- No Application Fee
- Apply at: **apply.mst.edu** or on the Common App
- Admission decision can be made with **unofficial** transcript and test scores
- Students can apply Test Optional for Fall 2024
